- Williamson College (WC) acknowledges that it has signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education the Certification and Agreement for funds received under Section 2003(a)(1) of the ARP to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- 2. The total amount of funds WC has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$49,324.
- 3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 2003(a)(1) of the ARP as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter) is \$49,324.
- 4. The estimated total number of students at WC that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the ARP program is 70.
- 5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the ARP program is 20.
- 6. The method(s) used by WC to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 2003(a)(1) of the ARP are outlined below:

WC will distribute the funds to students who are considered enrolled as of December 1, 2021, that are Title IV aid-eligible with an expected family contribution (EFC) of \$5,900 or less for the 2021-2022 award year, i.e., to those students with the greatest identified need. Grants are prioritized to students who demonstrate the most need. Need is determined by Expected Family Contribution, as calculated by the FAFSA Federal Needs Analysis. This approach provides aid to approximately 29% of WC's students.
